Winners chosen in the NCC's coast-to-coast student banner contest

Seven youth banners to be raised in the Capital; contest winners to share their experience with the Governor General of Canada

Canada's Capital Region — The National Capital Commission (NCC), in partnership with Classroom Connections and the Office of the Secretary to the Governor General, is pleased to announce the winners of this year's cross-Canada student banner contest — with young winners to have their artwork exhibited in the heart of the Capital beginning this week.

Students in Grades 5 through 8 (Elementary 5 through Secondary 2 in Quebec) were asked to create and submit a one-of-a-kind banner design to the <u>"Raise Your Voices!"</u> <u>National Student Banner Contest</u>. They responded overwhelmingly with more than 1049 submissions received from coast to coast to coast. The inspired designs represent issues and topics of importance to Canadian youth.

The seven winning banners have been professionally produced by the NCC and will be flown in Major's Hill Park until October 2013 where they will be seen by thousands of residents and visitors.

NEW! On May 31st, the artists who created the top three banners, along with their classmates, will meet with the Governor General of Canada, His Excellency the Right Honourable David Johnston, via videoconference, to discuss their banner and how they can participate in building smarter and more caring communities, as well as to share their hopes for the future.
